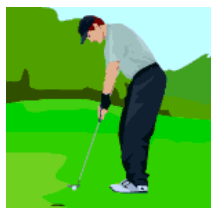

September 22, 2011: "*The Magic of Fighting Fraud*", speaker is John Tonsick CPA, CFE.

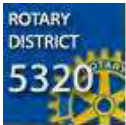

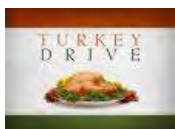
