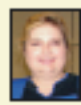

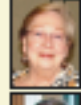

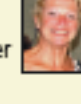

VISITING THE BLIND CHILDREN'S LEARNING CENTER  
A SPECIAL TREAT FOR LAST THURSDAY'S MEETING



CLASSROOM BUILDING AT BLIND CHILDREN'S LEARNING CENTER

One of the annual recipients of the Tustin-Santa Ana Rotary Club Foundation grants, the 50 year-old Blind Children's Learning Center was the site of our October 20th meeting. Many of us have *heard* about the work they do, but the *visual impact* of their three acre administrative office and Early Childhood Center in Tustin delivered considerable enlightenment to many of the members who were welcomed there last Thursday by their Executive Director, Kim Neuhauser.

The Early Childhood Center contains six classrooms for infants and children from 6 months to 6 years of age. The center is a combined community project, built and maintained by volunteers.

In addition to the Children's Classrooms there is a Multi-Media Library, Counseling Offices, Occupational Therapy Offices and two Children's Play Areas, one in the classroom building and a larger outdoor one for kids 3 to 6 years of age. The staff of the BCLC Infant Family Focus and Youth Outreach programs, who provide services to the Community, have their offices off-campus.

Imagine being a blind person in Orange County in 1962. There were no services or support organizations. Against this backdrop six blind adults founded "Services for the Blind, Orange County" which subsequently became the current "Blind Children's Learning Center, These founders discovered the key to helping visually impaired children was *to start working with them at a very young age.*

The BCLC felt it was especially important for a follow-through during the school years - to help the individual develop confidence and self esteem. Only then can visually impacted children overcome the many obstacles that they would encounter as they grow and mature. With this in mind, the BCLC developed a learning model that draws children into the mainstream of life early on... and they begin to acquire skills that they will need throughout their lives.

The **Vision:** Every visually impaired or deaf child has the opportunity to integrate fully into the Community.

The **Values:** We believe that all blind, visually impaired or deaf-blind children deserve support and education to reach their full potential. We believe the *parents* of visually impaired, blind or deaf blind children deserve support and education to become the best first teachers and effective advocates for their children. We believe the community can and should embrace these special children and their families.

The **Mission:** Our mission is to provide early intervention, education and services for blind, visually impaired or deaf-blind children and their families to empower their independence.

Our volunteers at BCLC know that their individual contributions are a major part of this organization's success. In fiscal 2009-2010 they had the support of 1,095 volunteers who donated 7,312 hours of service to the organization.
