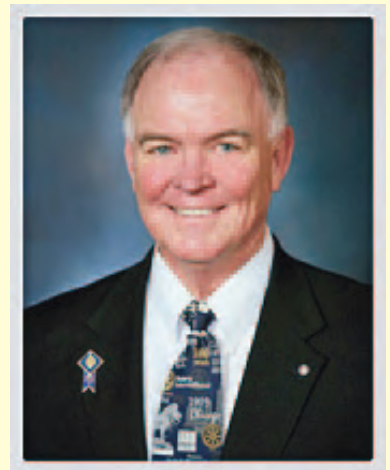

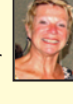

Our Speaker last week was Tustin High School teacher Ed Hernandez who described their *TTech program* which is a partnership with *Project Lead The Way* (a leader in STEM education) and *Coastline ROP*. It brings technical resources to the school, including products from Dell, SolidWorks, Fischertechnik, VEX Robotics, Epilog Laser, Z-Corp and Dimension 3-d printers.

A project-based curriculum with emphasis on electronics, robotics and implementation of alternative energy technology.

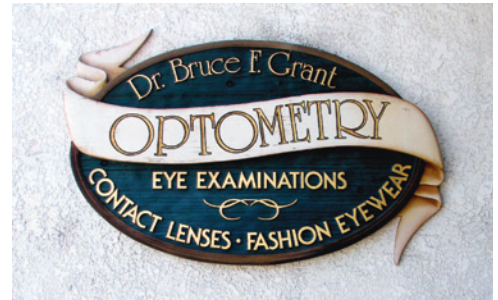

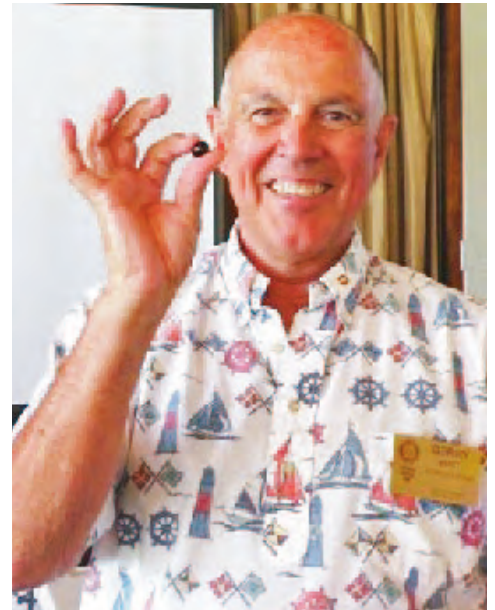

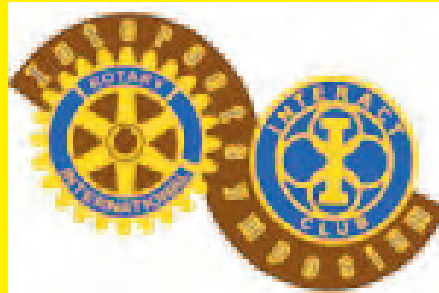

Layne Calvert stopped by last week's meeting to tell of a major symposium for Interact Clubs planned for next month at the Outdoor Education Center in Orange under the sponsorship of Rotary Districts 5240, 5260, 5280, 5300, 5320 and 5340.

A "team" from each Interact Club, consisting of the President, Faculty Advisor and a Rotary Liaison. The three day Symposium will have a single \$495 fee to cover the registration of the team.

This will be an outstanding opportunity for Rotary Liaisons, Club Presidents and Interact School Advisors to improve leadership skills, exchange ideas on how you to make your Interact Club more successful and share fellowship. Since it was formed in 1993 the Symposium has provided information and training to thousands of participants.

New and old Interact Clubs from the seven adjoining Rotary Districts in California and Nevada are invited. The Symposium is led by experienced Rotary and Student Leaders. The program is similar to Rotary's President Elect Training Seminar.
